## ARCHDIOCESE FOR THE MILITARY SERVICES

This weekend, St. Vincent Parish will take up a second collection benefiting the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS). Established by Saint John Paul II in 1985, the AMS is the only U.S. diocese responsible for providing pastoral care to men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or working for the federal government beyond U.S. borders. Including families, AMS priests and deacons serve approximately 1.8 million Catholics who hail from 50 states and U.S. territories. While the salaries and retirement of Catholic military chaplains are paid for by the U.S. Government, the AMS does not receive funding from the government or military for program and administrative costs. This collection is taken up once every three years. Please give generously.

## Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau PRESS RELEASE

The Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau reports a second allegation of sexual abuse of a minor involving Fr. William E. Donovan, deceased (1975). Father Donovan is already listed as a clergy against whom prior allegations of the abuse of a minor have occurred. This allegation pertains to a period between 1968-1972. Following procedures outlined in diocesan Safe Environment Policies, the Diocese has notified civil authorities of the allegation. Additionally, pastoral support has been provided to the victim/survivor.

Father William Edward Donovan was born in 1930 in Rome, New York. He was ordained a priest in 1955 in St. Louis for the Archdiocese of St. Louis. The Diocese of Springfield Cape Girardeau was formed in 1956 from territory that was, prior to 1956, part of the Archdiocese of St. Louis and the Diocese of Kansas City. Father Donovan died February 9, 1975.

### **Assistance to victim survivors**

The Diocese will reach out to every person who has been the victim of sexual abuse as a minor by anyone acting in the name of the Church, whether the abuse was recent or occurred many years in the past. This outreach will include provision of counseling, spiritual assistance, support groups, and other social services agreed upon by the victim and the Diocese. The Assistance Coordinator will aid in the immediate pastoral care of persons who claim to have been sexually abused as minors by clergy or other diocesan personnel.

If you suspect a child is in imminent danger of abuse, please call 911 immediately. Any suspected or known abuse of a minor must first be immediately reported to the Missouri Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline: 800-392-3738 or 844-CAN-TELL. For suspected or known abuse of vulnerable or eligible adults, the Missouri Adult Abuse and Neglect Hotline is 800-392-0210.
