Guidelines for Fasting/Abstinence during Lent

Abstinence is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from the consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of fasting for ages 18 - 59 (inclusive). The Church defines fasting as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal, as well as no eating between meals.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial suitable to their condition.

Stations of the Cross - A Beautiful Tradition

The Stations of the Cross are images of stories about the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Most of the stories which make up the Stations were drawn from Scripture, and others, such as Saint Veronica wiping the face of Jesus, were taken from tradition. The route traditionally held to have been taken



by Jesus to his death at Calvary (Golgotha) in Jerusalem is called the Via Dolorosa or the Sorrowful Way. The Stations were erected in local churches as a way of bringing this prayerful experience to those who could not travel to Jerusalem.

Stations of the Cross are celebrated every Friday during Lent at 6:15 p.m. in English and at 7:00 p.m. in Spanish. You are also invited on Wednesday afternoons at 2:00 p.m. as the school prays the Stations on March 18, 25, and April 1. Please join in this devotional prayer and make it a part of your Lenten journey.

Dear Priests, Deacons and Parishioners,

As the coronavirus becomes more prevalent in the nation's headlines, we are expecting questions to arise regarding the preparedness of our parishes in dealing with the outbreak. While there is no cause for panic, it is good to be proactive and take precautionary measures.

On a practical level, I ask that the following precautions be implemented in order to protect parishioners from the spread of illness when they gather for Holy Mass:

- Sanitize all sacred vessels before and after all Masses (with soap and hot water), because germs may survive on surfaces up to 24 or more hours.
- Suspend the exchange of the sign of peace.
- Suspend holding hands at the Our Father (for those who do so).
- Suspend the distribution of Holy Communion via the chalice.
- Sanitize holy water fonts weekly or discontinue the use of holy water for the meantime.
- Encourage good hygiene including alcohol-based hand sanitizer lotion in restrooms and public areas, and proper cough and sneeze etiquette. It is especially important for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to implement these measures.
- Visit the website of your local or state health department for updates.

On a pastoral level, I ask the following practices:

- Encourage the sick to stay at home.
- Bring Holy Communion to the sick at their place of residence.
- Identify those who are vulnerable, i.e., the elderly or disabled and check on them.

You will also find attached a protocol for our Catholic schools and Parish Schools of Religion programs. With the assurance of my prayers for your health and well-being and united with Our Lady at the foot of the Cross, I am,

Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau Public Health Concerns with regard to the Coronavirus

Catholic School and Parish School of Religion Directives

The Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau has issued the following directives for Catholic schools and Parish School of Religion (PSR) programs, as precautionary measures, in dealing with the potential for an outbreak of the coronavirus:

- Our Catholic Schools and PSR programs will follow the decision of their local city or area public schools in their decision to close or suspend their school or PSR operations.
- We would ask teachers to prepare lesson plans for at least two weeks in advance, so teachers would be able to give direction to their students, in the event school would be suspended for this period of time.
- Our schools/principals need to develop communication plans, so that schools will be able to continually communicate with parents during a potential long-term closing of a school. This will facilitate the continuance of students' educational programs off-site.
- In the event of a suspected case of coronavirus, the health department of the city or county should be contacted immediately for further instructions.



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 9 God's Standard

The prayer in the First Reading confesses the failure of God's people to stay faithful to him. When they behaved no better than other nations, God let his people be scattered among those nations. God demands that his people live by a higher standard, as we hear in the Gospel passage. God, whose mercy overflows, expects us to treat others with that same remarkable compassion. In what specific way can you share God's compassion today? *Today's Readings: Daniel 9:4b–10; Psalm 79:8, 9, 11 and 13; Luke 6:36–38.*

Tuesday, March 10 Reversals

Isaiah's warning is vivid: God will allow his people to be struck down if they do not repent of their wrongdoing, leaving them as blood-red as their sins. Jesus also speaks about reversals: true disciples serve others rather than seek honor and privileges for themselves. Make a list of people who radically changed their lives for Christ. What do their stories teach you? *Today's Readings: Isaiah 1:10, 16–20; Psalm 50:8–9, 16bc–17, 21 and 23; Matthew 23:1–12.*

Wednesday, March 11 Misunderstood

Jesus and Jeremiah both spoke for God and suffered greatly for it. Jeremiah laments that his enemies are waiting for him to speak one wrong word so that they can declare him a false prophet and get rid of him. Jesus tells how he, too, will be rejected by his people. Jesus' words seem lost on his disciples, who want the very honor and glory that he warns them against seeking. Perhaps they simply did not like what Jesus was telling them. What is Jesus saying to you that you find hard to accept? *Today's Readings: Jeremiah 18:18–20; Psalm 31:5–6, 14, 15–16; Matthew 20:17–28.*

Thursday, March 12 What Is in Our Hearts?

God knows what is in our hearts far better than we do. God knows who is growing in holiness and who is dying "in a lava waste." The rich man never bothered to probe his heart, much less open it in love to Lazarus. Even in death, the rich man puts himself before the beggar, for he asks Abraham to send Lazarus for water, as if Lazarus were a servant. Open your heart to God. Ask God to show you the people you fail to love and what you can do to serve them. *Today's Readings: Jeremiah 17:5–10; Psalm 1:1–2, 3, 4 and 6; Luke 16:19–31.*

Friday, March 13 The End of Rejection

Despite the terrible action his brothers take, Joseph eventually forgives them and even saves them during a famine. The religious leaders who try to arrest Jesus might also have envied him because the crowds were surrounding Jesus instead of them. Finally, these leaders get rid of Jesus, only to hear that he rose from the dead. It was not too late for them to be forgiven and to share in the new life God offered in his Son. Pray for or talk with someone who needs to hear that God loves and forgives them. *Today's Readings: Genesis* 37:3-4, 12-13a, 17b-28a; Psalm 105:16-17, 18-19, 20-21; Matthew 21:33-43, 45-46.

Saturday, March 14 Prodigal Love

Our God who delights in clemency is like the father who watches for his younger son's return. The father's love is extravagant. First, he pours love out on the son who took from him and left, and then he pours his love upon the son who speaks of him with resentment and contempt. We are far stingier with our love, preferring to love only those who seem to deserve it. Take part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and rejoice that God shows his love abundantly. *Today's Readings: Micah* 7:14–15, 18–20; Psalm 103:1–2, 3–4, 9–10, 11–12; Luke 15:1–3, 11–32.
