Diocesan Development Fund

The Diocesan Development Fund Campaign (DDF) is the annual campaign for the Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau. The funds raised through the campaign advance the mission of the Catholic Church through a host of ministries that assist families, parishes, and the Diocese as a whole.

This year St. Vincent de Paul's parish goal is \$250,000 with a participation goal of 600 households. To date St. Vincent parishioners have given \$229,105 (91.6%) toward the goal. 438 families (73% of donor goal) have responded so far with a pledge of prayer and money. Diving into the beauty of the Catholic faith has never been easier: at home, on the go, or from any internet connected device. Act of Spiritual Communion

The "Act of Spiritual Communion" is a prayer for anyone who desires to receive the Eucharist but is unable.

"My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.'

Mission Co-op Appeal

Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, our Diocese was not able to participate in the annual Mission Co-op. This appeal is our parish's opportunity to visit with a religious community priest who speaks about the missions. Many of the Mission priests were not able to travel because of the bans throughout the world.

Every parish in the Diocese is still being asked to have a collection for a specific religious community that supports the mission work of the Church. The religious community assigned to us here at St. Vincent de Paul Parish is the IMS, Indian Missionary Society. The website for the IMS is: http://ims.org.in.

The IMS is a missionary religious community working in India. Father Gaspar A. Pinto founded the Indian Missionary Society on November 3. 1941, in Varanasi (known as Benares) in the northern part of India. The specific purpose of IMS is *pioneering evangelization*. Namely, they begin work in a non-Christian area of northern India, develop it, and establish a Catholic community. They eventually hand this parish over to the local Diocese. Then they move to another new area to continue the evangelization activities. The Indian Missionary Society is presently working in 89 centers and parishes spread in 43 dioceses of India.

The IMS has 225 priests and 150 seminarians at different stages of their training. This year the IMS had five ordinations to the priesthood and they are already assigned to various places.

Besides the work of starting parishes, the Indian Missionary Society also

- works to empower women
- has medical camps and offers medical assistance
- sponsors social and developmental projects and programs
- creates safe drinking water by installing hand pumps and wells
- sponsors an HIV/AIDS rehabilitation center for 100 children and 45 adults
- runs a center for children who are mentally challenged
- operates a center for adults who are mentally challenged
- maintains a center for hearing impaired children.

PSR (Parish School of Religion)

Recognizing that parents are the primary teachers of the faith to their children, our Parish School of Religion exists to help parents of our families who attend public school. Our PSR program exists to support parents in teaching faithfulness and understanding the life of the Church. Because of the pandemic this year, our PSR program on Wednesday evenings will take a new shape. We are going to have two learning tracks.

Track 1 will be weekly. This will include our First Graders (First Sacraments) who are beginning to learn about the faith for the very first time in a formal setting. It will also include our Second Graders (Second Sacraments) who are doing the final preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. In addition, our weekly track will include Seventh Graders and Eighth Graders who are preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation after Eighth Grade. This track will begin on Wednesday, October 7, and will be held from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Track 2 will be twice a month on the first and third Wednesdays. This will include the rest of our students in grades 3, 4, 5 and 6. These four grades, along with their parents and *all* parents of grades 1, 2, 7 and 8, will come together in the Church for a family learning session. At the end of the family learning session, grades 3, 4, 5 and 6 will have "homework" to take home and do over the next two weeks. This track will begin Wednesday, October 7, and will be held from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Understandably, this is different from previous years, but this is due to the pandemic. It is necessary to meet weekly with our children preparing for Sacraments and help them prepare for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation. For the other grades, we hope to provide a good curriculum by meeting with them twice a month and giving them their religion homework to do in between gatherings. Even with the different and unusual, we hope to provide a good faith program for our young children and their parents.


