First Reconciliation Parent Meeting

(Baptismal certificates must be obtained from the church of Baptism; please do not contact the school office for a copy.) A child will not be registered for his/ her second grade sacraments or receive study materials until paperwork is complete.

If your child has *not been baptized* in the Catholic faith and wishes to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharist in the future, please contact Kathy Hotop-Raines at 335-7667.

In order to celebrate First Reconciliation and First Communion a baptized child should be regularly attending Mass on the weekend, be registered in the parish and have regularly attended religion classes for at least one full year before beginning sacrament studies.





Gospel Reading

Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying,

A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."

Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city.

Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore,

into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests.

But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is

it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants,

'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.'
