# The Feasts of All Saints and All Souls

This Sunday, November 1, the church celebrates the **Solemnity of All Saints**. The Feast of All Saints gives Catholics the opportunity to honor all saints, both those solemnly recognized by the church and those whose holiness of life is known only to God and those who knew them. All Saints Day is a day to honor these people and celebrate their lives:

- Attend Mass as a family or with friends. The readings and hymns are specially chosen for this day and focus on those who have shown faith in God.
- Read books about saints. Before they were called saints, they were regular people dealing with everyday life. Many books have been written to show the kind of struggles they had to deal with.
- Read sections of the Bible containing stories of saints. The books of the Old and New Testament contain stories of people who fought great odds to follow God's word and keep their faith, often losing their lives in the process.
- Spend the day with your family watching movies or documentaries about saints. You can find videos at Catholic stores, book stores, and <u>Formed.org</u>.
- Help to continue the work started by a saint. Look for a charity dedicated to your favorite saint and contact the coordinator. Ask if there are volunteer opportunities.
- Donate to charities in honor of the person who has had the most positive influence in your life or the canonized saint of your choice. You can donate money, food or goods.
- Pass the lesson on. Teach others what you have learned from the people who have touched your life. The stories will be especially helpful for children who need role models.
- Spend time in prayer. You might pray the following which is taken from the *Liturgy of the Hours* for All Saints Day.

Father, all-powerful and ever-living God, today we rejoice in the holy men and women of every time and place. May their prayers bring us your forgiveness and love. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

In commemoration of the faithful departed, **All Souls Day** is celebrated on Monday, November 2. This feast will be celebrated at the regularly scheduled 6:30 Mass. Please take this opportunity to pray for your deceased family members, friends, and all departed.
