St. Rose Philippine Duchesne

In 1918 the Missouri Historical Society named Sister Rose Philippine Duchesne the greatest of the state's pioneer women. Although her life was a series of extraordinary adventures, those who met her were most struck by her spirit of quiet reflection.

Philippine (as she was known) was born in Grenoble in France. She grew up during the turbulent times prior to the French Revolution. Her father, a lawyer, was also an outspoken politician who believed that the monarchy



should be overthrown. Her mother was a person of faith in a time when that was not fashionable. Philippine, who was strongly influenced by her, joined a convent. Shortly afterward, though, the Revolution began, and all convents and monasteries were disbanded. Philippine spent the next ten years teaching neglected children and caring for the sick.

When the Reign of Terror ended and a spirit of greater religious tolerance emerged, she and four other nuns from her convent joined a new religious order, the Society of the Sacred Heart. Thus she came to know Mother Madeleine Sophie Barat, who would herself become canonized.

Philippine longed to work with Native Americans. At the age of 49 she was sent to the United States as superior of a small group of sisters. They had been invited to assist the archbishop of St. Louis with religious instruction. In the village of St. Charles, Missouri, she founded a convent in a small log cabin and began a school for the daughters of pioneer settlers. During the next few years, she also founded schools in Mississippi and Louisiana. She and her sisters suffered many hardships, from forest fires and epidemics to hunger. In her work with settlers, she fought prejudice against African Americans.

In 1840, at the age of 71, she accompanied a group of sisters opening a mission for Potawatomi Indians at what is now Sugar Creek, Missouri. At last her vision of serving among Native Americans had been realized.

Too frail to teach, she prayed while the other sisters worked with the children. The Potawatomi described her as "the woman who prays always." After only a year at the mission, she became ill. At the age of 83 she died at St. Charles, where she is buried. Rose Philippine Duchesne was canonized in 1988. She is remembered each year on November 18.

Our Response to the Corona Virus

Attendance is limited in the Church. The Church is marked for "social distancing". When the Church space is filled, people will be encouraged to go to the upper meeting room where Mass can be seen and heard. In addition, Holy Communion is taken to the upper meeting room. *Please note that entering any part of the Church requires a face mask!*

Social Distancing needs to be practiced. Families still need to keep six feet of separation from other families. **If you are showing any symptoms of sickness, please stay home.** Remember, during this time, there are to be NO hugs or handshakes!

A general dispensation from the Sunday obligation remains. If you or your family feel more comfortable to stay at home because of the Coronavirus threat, make plans to continue to keep the Sabbath holy by participating in livestream and pre-recorded Masses. Our parish Mass is recorded on Saturday at 5:00 p.m. and posted immediately to our YouTube and Parish website.

Please remember! There still will be a risk for anyone who attends a public Mass. Even with best health practices and strictest social distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the Coronavirus. Cleaning will continue but no one should expect that they will be any safer from germs than other public spaces. To prevent risks the Church will be supplied with plenty of hand sanitizer in various locations. Also, remember that the Church space is sanitized each day after each Mass

Finally, let's strive for progress and not perfection. There will no doubt be challenges and frustrations. Things may not go according to plan. But we believe following these guidelines is a reasonable sacrifice. If we all work together, we can ease back into our celebration of the Holy Eucharist and continue to incrementally return to normal. However, if we look for ways to get around the regulations, we will likely create situations that force us to take steps backward. In the long run, please remember that these guidelines have been created for everyone's safety! Finally, let us continue to pray for all those who have lost loved ones to the Coronavirus, for those struggling with the disease now, and all those living in fear of the unknown. 

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.


