Today's Readings: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11; Luke 1:46-48, 49-50, 53-54; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24; John 1:6-8, 19-28. St. Paul tells the Christians in Thessalonica to discern carefully whether a word or action is truly from God, but he also warns them not to oppose the action of God's Spirit simply because it is new or unfamiliar to them. A few decades earlier some people wondered if John the Baptist was acting according to God's Spirit. They questioned him thoroughly, but despite John's testimony, they refused to believe that God had sent him. They did not rejoice in his words because John did not fit their expectations.

Although the words of our First Reading are beautiful and compelling, some people did not believe this prophecy because their experience was very different. The prophet describes the glorious restoration of Israel, but decades of ruin made the fulfillment of that promise seem remote. People struggled to rejoice in the prophet's words.

When God doesn't meet our expectations, we struggle to rejoice, too. We may question what, if anything, God is doing. As we light the pink candle of our Advent wreath, we ask God to permeate our darkness, especially our perplexed hearts. We ask God to help us see all that God is doing and wants to do through us. We also ask God to help us meet his expectations for us: expectations that we will always seek his light and rejoice and give thanks in the light we will find.

Our Response at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church to the Corona Virus

Attendance is limited in the Church. The Church is marked for "social distancing". This will especially be true over the Solemnity of Christmas! When the Church space is filled, people will be directed to go to the Upper Meeting Room where Mass can be seen and heard. In addition, Holy Communion is taken to the Upper Meeting Room.

On Christmas Eve, at the 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Masses, when the Church space and the Upper Meeting Room are full, people will be directed to go to the DePaul Center Gym for Mass at 4:15 p.m. and 6:15 p.m.

Please note that entering any part of the Church or the DePaul Center requires a face mask!

If you have a fever or are showing any symptoms of sickness, please stay home.

Social Distancing is to be practiced. Families still need to keep six feet of separation from other families. During this time, remember, there are to be NO hugs or handshakes!

A general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday and Holy Days remains. If you or your family feel more comfortable to stay at home because of the Coronavirus threat, make plans to continue to keep the Sabbath holy by participating in livestream and pre-recorded Masses. Our parish Sunday Mass and Christmas Masses will be live streamed on our Parish Facebook page and posted to our Parish website.

Please remember! There still will be a risk for anyone who attends a public Mass. Even with best health practices and strictest social distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the coronavirus. Cleaning will continue but no one should expect that they will be any safer from germs than other public spaces. To prevent risks the Church will be supplied with plenty of hand sanitizer in various locations. Also, remember that the Church space is sanitized each day after each Mass

Finally, let us strive for progress and not perfection. There will no doubt be challenges and frustrations. Things may not go according to plan. But we believe following these guidelines is a reasonable sacrifice. If we all work together, we can ease back into our celebration of the Holy Eucharist and continue to incrementally return to normal. However, if we look for ways to get around the regulations, we will likely create situations that force us to take steps back. In the long run, please remember that these guidelines have been created for everyone's safety! Finally, let us continue to pray for all those who have lost loved ones to the Coronavirus, for those struggling with the disease now, and all those living in fear of the unknown ... may God be with all of us!

Gospel Reading

John 1:6-8, 19-28

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for vourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." This happened in Bethany across the Jordan,

where John was baptizing.



Celebrating the Sacraments Celebrando los Sacramentos

Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least **six months** in advance. (If you have been married before, an annulment may need to be done first.)
