Seeing Ourselves in the Story

Today's readings: Isaiah 50:4-7; Psalm 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24; Philippians 2:6-11; Mark 14:1-15:47. As Holy Week begins, we herald Jesus as he triumphantly enters Jerusalem. We cry, "Hosanna!" The excitement of his coming reaches us across time and space. Jesus is the one for whom Israel has been waiting. He will bring about the longed-for kingdom of justice and peace.

From jubilant welcome, the mood shifts quickly, and before long the crowd shouts again, this time not "Hosanna," but "Crucify him!"

One way that we can reflect upon the events of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection is to imagine ourselves in the story. If you were part of the crowd, what might have made you excited about Jesus as he entered? What might you have felt as public opinion changed, and people became fearful of him? Are you one of the disciples? How do you feel in the garden as Jesus prays? What is it like when he is arrested? Another perspective you might take is that of the women. They had come with Jesus to Jerusalem and were witnesses to all that had happened. What would it be like to see the passion through their eyes?

Entering into Holy Week, make space for silence, prayer, and reflection. Prepare yourself to celebrate the greatest of all mysteries, the moment that redeemed all of history: the resurrection.


Prayer Requests

Confessions During Holy Week

Hopefully everyone has taken advantage of the many opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the season of Lent. If you have not, there are still some chances. Priests will be available for confessions on:

- Palm Sunday, March 28, "on the hour" from 5:00 7:00 p.m.
- "Spy Wednesday," March 31, "on the hour" from 12:00 8:00 p.m.

(These are the last opportunities for confessions during Holy Week. During the Sacred Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, there will be no confessions.)

Livestreamed Masses

The Mass celebrated on Holy Thursday at 7:30 p.m., the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday at 7:30 p.m., and the Mass celebrated on Easter Sunday at 8:00 a.m. will be livestreamed and will be available to view on the St. Vincent de Paul Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/svcape/). The videos will also be available to view after Masses on the parish website (www.svcape.com).

Good Friday Collection

On Good Friday, a collection will be taken for the Holy Land. Your financial contribution helps to support the struggling Christian community and to protect its holiest places. An envelope for the Holy Land collection is available in your monthly packet. Please be generous.

Please remember that Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. Those 14 years and older who are physically able are required to abstain from meat. Fasting is required for those ages 18 through 59. The Church defines fasting as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal, as well as no eating between meals.

First Friday Adoration Moved to Second Friday

Because the first Friday of April is on Good Friday this year, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be moved to the second Friday of April! Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will begin after the 6:30 a.m. Mass on Friday, April 9. Adoration continues all day and closes with Benediction at 5:15 p.m. Please come and pray for good vocations to the priesthood and religious life from St. Vincent de Paul Parish.

Ideas for the Home

Holy Thursday - If you cannot attend the celebration of the Lord's Last Supper at Church on Holy Thursday, why not try to do something in your own home-church on that evening.

- You could have a special meal on Thursday and for your Meal Blessing Prayer, read one of the accounts from Scripture about the Last Supper (Luke 22:1-22; Mark 14:12-26, Matthew 26:17-30 or 1 Corinthians 11:23-26).
- Holy Thursday's emphasis on the "Washing of Feet" also gave rise to the ancient tradition of "Spring Cleaning"...getting the home ready for the great Feast of Easter. You can tell children about this tradition and ask to them to clean their rooms in order to observe Holy Thursday and get ready for Easter. You might read John 13:1-2.
- After having your special Holy Thursday Meal, maybe you could come to Church for a little quiet prayer in Adoration with the Lord in the "Garden of Gethsemane" where the Altar of Repose is kept. If this is not possible, why not light some candles and say some special prayers before bedtime.

Good Friday - Fast and abstain on this day! This is required by the Catholic Church if you are healthy and 18 years or older. You can also encourage your kids to skip snacks on this sacred day.

- Keep fun activities to a minimum. For example, do not have an Easter party on Good Friday.
- Good Friday is the first day of the **Divine Mercy Novena**, so start it today.
- The most sacred hours during Good Friday are from 12:00 noon to 3:00 p.m. because this is when Jesus was on the cross. These hours are sometimes known as the three hours of agony. During this time, try to have a special silence in your home and encourage your children to do the same (to the best of their ability). Turn off the phones, television, and other screen devices. Maybe as a family you could pray the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary, read from the Bible about the Crucifixion, or maybe have your children quietly draw or color religious pictures.

Holy Saturday

• Make Easter Story Cookies (AKA: Resurrection Cookies). This is a fun way to prepare for Easter with your kids! It is a beloved tradition in many Catholic homes on Holy Saturday. Each ingredient for the cookies has a symbolism to the Resurrection story, and the process of making the cookies represents the Resurrection and has coordinating Scripture! 

The Nicene Creed










To you, O blessed Joseph, do we come in our tribulation. and having implored the help of your most holy Spouse, we confidently invoke your patronage also.


