



Marian Consecration

Christmas Gifts for Birthright

If you wish to share with a Birthright baby during this Christmas season, gifts will be collected in the gathering area at all Christmas Masses. Most items collected will be used in layettes given to mothers just before their babies are born. Items needed include **new** heavy weight pajamas, warm outfits, sleepers, and long sleeve onesies (sizes o-3 and 3-6 months). Birthright is also in need of small fleece blankets (new and gently used), receiving blankets (new and gently used), diapers and pullups (all sizes), baby lotion and wash (15 oz.), bottles (4 and 8 oz.), Similac ProAdvanced formula, sippy cups, hooded towels, washcloths, baby hygiene items, small board books, small stuffed animals (new), teething toys, breastfeeding supplies (shields and storage bags), sanitary napkins, new or gently used maternity clothing (XS-3XL), and nursing bras (new or gently used). Also needed are gently used baby clothing for boys and girls (18 months - 4T). Your generosity is appreciated.

Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least **six months** in advance. (If you have been married before, an annulment may need to be done first.)

Journeying through Advent

St. Lucy

Monday, December 13

St. Lucy was an early Christian martyr who died during the Roman persecutions. Accounts say that her eyes were gouged out when she was martyred, and therefore she is the patron of those with eye illnesses. Her feast day is often celebrated with candles because, in the Northern Hemisphere, the day is among the shortest days of the year. St. Lucy is one of eight women included in the canon of the Mass. *Today's readings: Numbers 24:2-7, 15-17a; Psalm 25:4-5ab, 6, 7bc, 8-9; Matthew 21:23-27.*

St. John of the Cross

Tuesday, December 14

St. John of the Cross, a doctor of the Church, was a priest, mystic, and writer who lived in Spain in the sixteenth century. One of his best-known works is The Dark Night of the Soul. He was a close collaborator of St. Teresa of Avila. Today's readings: Zephaniah 3:1-2, 9-13; Psalm 34:2-3, 6-7, 17-18, 19, 23; Matthew 21:28-32.

Signs

Wednesday, December 15

The blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have the good news proclaimed to them." Often we wish for miraculous signs that will help us know where to go. But these actions of Jesus are that and more. The hope of the people of Israel was in a person who would bring about a new kingdom in which the sufferings of this world would be left behind. These particular signs are a message to John the Baptist: Jesus is the long-awaited messiah. *Today's readings: Isaiah 45:6b-8, 18, 21c-25; Psalm 85:9ab, 10, 11-12, 13-14; Luke 7:18b-23*.

God's Faithfulness

Thursday, December 16

God's love will be constant, the covenant of peace unbroken, even if the mountains fall. While people often disappoint us when commitments are not kept, God's promise is not reliant on our faithfulness but on the faithfulness of God. We know that God is a keeper of promises: promises kept to Sarah, to Hannah, to Elizabeth, to Mary, to Noah, to Abraham, to Moses, to John the Baptist. We can trust that even in our darkest moments God is faithful to us as well. *Today's readings: Isaiah 54:1-10; Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12a, 13b; Luke 7:24-30.*

O Wisdom

Friday, December 17

Within the Church's liturgical tradition, the "O" Antiphons are prayed the seven days before Christmas. Each of these antiphons presents a title for the messiah. Many are familiar with these seven titles because they begin the verses of the hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." The first antiphon, which is used on December 17, is O Wisdom. You might sing this verse of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," or you might pray Evening Prayer. You can find resources online, including apps to assist you, in praying the Liturgy of the Hours. *Today's readings: Genesis 49:2, 8-10; Psalm 72:1-2, 3-4ab, 7-8, 17; Matthew 1:1-17.*

The Dream of St. Joseph

Saturday, December 18

St. Joseph was a righteous man, meaning he followed the law of Moses, and according to the Law, Mary would be put to death. St. Joseph also must have been a man of great compassion who was accustomed to God's voice. When the angel came to him in a dream, he immediately believed. Moreover, he immediately acted. Today, spend time in silent prayer so that, like Joseph, you may know your call when it comes and answer with your whole heart. *Today's readings: Jeremiah 23:5-8; Psalm 72:1-2, 12-13, 18-19; Matthew 1:18-25*.

Sunday, December 12

Rejoice!

Today's readings: Zephaniah 3:14-18a; Philemon 4:4-7; Isaiah 12:2-3, 4, 5-6; Luke 3:10-18. The nearness of Jesus, our salvation, is now made present and brings with it a call to rejoice.

In today's Gospel, the people ask John the Baptist what they are to do. His answer is always the same: act with justice. The Jewish people, then and now, await a messiah who will bring about perfect justice. John speaks to people waiting and watching, yesterday and today: act with justice.

Often, a need to change is not associated with "good news." Yet the people feel something in their hearts when they are with John. They experience his preaching as good news even when it is challenging. They desire kingdom of God and see that the world is not there yet. They are called to change. John also makes clear that they themselves do not have to do everything. That is also a hopeful message. Each person does their part, and their part is enough. It is God who brings about the kingdom of justice and peace, fulfilling the work begun in creation.

John speaks of a baptism with the Holy Spirit and fire. Fire can purify metal, and its heat in boiling water sterilizes objects. While preparing for Jesus' coming, we might ask the Spirit to purify our hearts so that we seek to act justly. What could you do this week to live the value of justice? What in you must be taken away to live this more perfectly?


