St. Vincent de Paul Parish Lenten Mission

This year's Lenten Parish Mission, Ablaze, will take place on Monday -Wednesday of this week (March 14-16). Deacon Keith Strohm will facilitate this event. Deacon Keith is the former Director of the Office for the New Evangelization and a Permanent Deacon for the Archdiocese of Chicago. He has extensive experience in creating programs of evangelization and is able to assist in the formation of groups that focus on the missioning of disciples of Jesus Christ. Deacon Keith is also the Executive Director of M3 Ministries (www.m3catholic.com) and a contributing author, along with six other collaborators, with Sherry Weddell for the book Becoming a Parish of Intentional Disciples — a follow-up to Forming Intentional Disciples. A Mission talk will take place on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday evenings at 6:30 p.m. If you are unable to attend in the evenings. Deacon Keith will also have a Mission talk after the added 8:00 a.m. Masses on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday mornings (about 8:45 a.m.). Make plans to attend all or part of the Lenten Parish Mission!

> Monday - The Father's Delight

What if you didn't have to earn God's love? What if performance had nothing to do with salvation? In this engaging talk, Deacon Keith explores the reality of the Father's love. You were created for an eternal life filled with peace, joy, freedom, and communion with God and each other. Using Scripture, Tradition, and personal stories seasoned with humor, this live presentation will draw you closer to the Father's Heart — which beats for you.

> Tuesday - Breaking The Power of Sin

"Jesus died for your sins." You may hear that a lot, but what does it mean that God's Son gave His life for you? In this powerful talk, Deacon Keith explores the mystery of sin and the Father's response in Jesus Christ. How does the Cross set you free? Is the Cross simply a declaration of sinfulness, or does it reveal something deeper? Why does it matter that Christ rose from the dead? Using his own unique style, Deacon Keith makes this central movement of the Christian faith accessible and the person of Jesus real for every listener.

> Wednesday - Unleashing the Spirit

The Lord frees you from the power of sin and death so that you might live in the fullness of His life - a life you were originally created for. Peace, joy, freedom, holiness, intimacy and love, integrity, fruitfulness, mercy, healing these are all hallmarks of the life received from Jesus, and they come through the gift of His Holy Spirit in Baptism. In this engaging talk, Deacon Keith explores what it means to live a life empowered by the Holy Spirit and shares how to unleash that Spirit for your sake and the sake of the world!




Confessions During Lent

Stations of the Cross — A Beautiful Tradition

The Stations of the Cross are images of stories about the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Most of the stories which make up the Stations were drawn from Scripture, and others,



such as Saint Veronica wiping the face of Jesus, were taken from tradition. The route traditionally held to have been taken by Jesus to his death at Calvary (Golgotha) in Jerusalem is called the Via Dolorosa or the Sorrowful Way. The Stations were erected in local churches as a way of bringing this prayerful experience to those who could not travel to Jerusalem.

Stations of the Cross are celebrated every Friday during Lent at 5:00 in Spanish and at 6:15 p.m. in English. Please join in this devotional prayer and make it a part of your Lenten journey.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will follow the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 p.m. each Friday during Lent.

Special Collection for Ukraine Solidarity Fund

Next weekend, March 19 - 20, St. Vincent de Paul Parish will join with other parishes in the Diocese to take up a special collection for the many families struggling in the area of Ukraine and Poland. The funds collected will be forwarded to the Knights of Columbus who are already helping families there. The relief funding is already being used to provide supplies and assistance. Through extensive local connections with churches and communities, as well as networks of local Knights and volunteers, essential resources and services are reaching families within hours of donations being received.

The Knights of Columbus have helped with the following

- Funds are being used to provide shelter, food, medical supplies, clothing and religious goods, as well as other humanitarian needs as identified, both directly in Ukraine and through refugee sites in Poland.
- Knights in Poland have established tents at the Polish-Ukrainian border to distribute food and water to refugees, continuing the spirit of the Order's "Everybody Welcome, Everything Free" campaign in Europe at the start of the 20th century.
- The Knights are working with both the Latin and Greek Catholic Church in Ukraine, with dioceses and councils in Poland, and with international humanitarian aid agencies to address needs quickly and effectively.
- Polish Knights of Columbus Councils have established collection sites in Kraków, and other cities where they are gathering and packaging medical supplies, warm clothing, and necessities.
- Based on the Knights' success in collecting and delivering relief supplies into Ukraine, a number of organizations and companies in Poland have asked to partner with the Knights of Columbus going forward.

During the season of Lent, the parishioners of St. Vincent are invited to collect food and paper items for distribution to the needy. **Beatitude Boxes** will be filled with specific food items and **Beatitude Bags** will be filled with specific paper products.

Return the items to the designated boxes in the gathering area no later than April 15. Boxes and bags will then be filled and given to the needy in the local community.



Guidelines for Fasting/ Abstinence during Lent

Abstinence is a penitential practice consisting of refraining from consumption of meat and is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays during Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for ages 18 - 59 (inclusive). The Church defines fasting as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal, as well as no eating between meals.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial suitable to their condition.

People often tout their accomplishments and their status. Jesus' message today is contrary to such behavior. He tells us that the greatest among us must be a servant, and that those who are humble will be exalted. Seek to be conscious of whether you are boastful. When we act as the person God created us to be, there is no need to boast, for each one of us is made in God's image and likeness. *Today's readings: Isaiah 1:10, 16-20; Psalm 50:8-9, 16bc-17, 21, and 23; Matthew 23:1-12.*

Jeremiah was a young prophet. When first called by God, he didn't want the job. He knew it would be tough to challenge people who were not following God's ways. Where does God fall on the list? *Today's readings: Jeremiah 17:5-10; Psalm 1:1-2, 3, 4, and 6; Luke 16:19-31.*

Faith during Adversity

Friday, March 18

Jealousy, hatred, vengeful feelings are strong human emotions that can be at the root of poor choices. Cyril of Jerusalem, whose feast day is today, was treated unjustly by his contemporaries but remained faithful. He was the bishop of Jerusalem and later named a doctor of the church. He is known for his homilies that prepared catechumens for initiation into the Church. *Today's readings: Genesis 37:3-4, 12-13a, 17b-28a; Psalm 105:16-17, 18-19, 20-21; Matthew 21:33-43, 45-46.*

St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary

Saturday, March 19

As we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we hear in the Gospel that Joseph is "a righteous man" unwilling to expose Mary to shame. When an angel visited Joseph in a dream, he showed great trust and confidence in God's plan for him and Mary. Joseph is the patron of the universal Church. Pray through the intercession of St. Joseph today, mindful of his example of faith. *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:4-5a, 12-14a, 16; Psalm 89:2-3, 4-5, 27, and 29; Romans 4:13, 16-18, 22; Matthew 1:16, 18-21, 24a.*

Sunday, March 13

Deep and Real Prayer

Today's readings: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18; Psalm 27:1, 7-8, 8-9, 13-14; Philippians 3:17-4:1; Luke 9:28b-36. In Luke's account of the Transfiguration, we hear these words: "Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray." The sole focus of the climb of the mountain was prayer.

What a stunning and revelatory moment it was for Peter, John, and James to experience Jesus praying deeply, changing in appearance, and even his clothes turning dazzling white. Seeing Jesus in his fullness, the apostles witnessed their friend's divinity. They were speechless when they heard God say, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

As we begin the second week of Lent, consider how Jesus prioritized prayer and the place it holds in your life. Do you set aside time for prayer? Do you allow space to be silent before God? Examine your schedule to determine a time for prayer.

St. Paul tells us in the second reading that "our citizenship is in heaven." There, Christ will change our bodies to "conform with his glorified body." But he tells them first that they need to imitate the holy life that he has set before them, changing their focus from earthly things. Help yourself focus this week on heavenly things by praying the psalm from today and contemplating the refrain, "The Lord is my light and my salvation."


