Care Portal Update

Many thanks to all who participate in the CarePortal ministry. CarePortal is an online platform that brings the needs of children and families (in a five county region) to the attention of area churches. Caseworkers uncover the need and communicate it online to local churches, giving parishioners an opportunity to respond and assist those in need. Many times, the needs address an issue for families that can keep the children from going into foster care. Here is one example of many that St. Vincent de Paul Parish has helped:

We have a single father who accepted placement of his three young daughters after they were removed from the care of their mother. The father has maintained his employment for five years and a safe and stable home for his children. Recently dad's vehicle broke down and it would be more cost effective to replace it than to fix it. Dad has found a 2014 Chrysler Town and Country minivan for \$9,995. The dealership is requesting a \$7,000 down payment. Dad is able to pay \$6,000 of the down payment on his own and is requesting assistance with \$1,000. Dad is able to pay the licensing of the vehicle and maintain insurance on the vehicle. Having a reliable vehicle would mean the world to this family as dad is responsible for taking the children to and from school, sporting events, doctor's appointments, visits with their mother, and of course getting dad to and from work.

Fill in your e-mail address, zip code and click on the Sign Up button. By signing up, you are only agreeing to receive email updates of needs in the area. You can decide if you feel called to respond to that particular need. This ministry provides the opportunity to not only provide tangible physical help, but also to build connections with those who need some extra support.

Other ways you can support CarePortal are:

- Helping to pickup and deliver the needed goods. Beds and dressers are the most frequently requested item but it takes people with a truck and strength to deliver them.
- At times the request is for car maintenance. Are you able to donate your time and mechanical skills to help with auto repairs?
- Monetary donations are welcome which go to St. Vincent's CarePortal support account. These donations are tax deductible.

Journeying Through Easter

Spirit of Life and Truth

Monday, May 23

When Jesus tells his disciples that the Spirit of truth is coming, he offers hope in the face of rejection and persecution. As disciples living in the present age when respect for life and living with integrity are a challenge, we can find hope in the Holy Spirit breathing in and among us in every moment. *Today's readings: Acts 16:11-15; Psalm 149:1b-2, 3-4, 5-6a and 9b; John 15:26-16:4a*.

Be Kind Tuesday, May 24

The word *kindness* is used in reference to God twice in the psalm today. God's kindness is abundant and never-ending. What about the kindness you exhibit? Is it contingent on your mood? Kindness has the ability to heal and strengthen a wounded soul. We need to be willing to search our hearts and find and share the kindness that has been shown to us. *Today's readings: Acts 16:22-34; Psalm 138:1-2ab, 2cde-3, 7c-8; John 16:5-11.*

A Guide to Truth

Wednesday, May 25

The Spirit reveals the truth that God is all knowing, loving, and merciful. Accepting this truth may mean that we need to change how we live with ourselves and others. The Holy Spirit is available to assist with this challenge. As today's Gospel states, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth." Pray for the grace to allow the Holy Spirit to work in and through you so that others come to know the truth. *Today's readings: Acts* 17:15, 22-18:1; Psalm 148:1-2, 11-12, 13, 14; John 16:12-15.

Palience Thursday, May 26

"A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me." These words left the disciples in a quandary. We too may be confused by how God is working in the world. Our questions are not always answered, but when we allow God to be involved in our lives, we live into the answers. Prayer and patience will lead to peace. *Today's readings: Acts 18:1-8; Psalm 98:1, 2-3ab, 3cd-4; John 16:16-20.*

Joy Unending

Friday, May 27

In today's Gospel, we hear that joy is birthed from pain. Jesus tells his disciples that the pain that they experience as followers will give way to joy when they see Christ again. We too can rest in the reassurance that our hearts will rejoice when we are with God. *Today's readings: Acts 18:9-18; Psalm 47:2-3, 4-5. 6-7; John 16:20-23.*

A Father's Love

Saturday, May 28

Jesus encourages the disciples when he says, "whatever you ask the Father in my name, he will give you." Our relationship with God through Jesus gives us confidence that our prayers will be heard. When you pray this week, do so with the awareness of the Father's love and care, the same love and care Jesus relied on in his ministry. *Today's readings: Acts* 18:23-28; *Psalm* 47:2-3, 8-9, 10; *John* 16:23b-28.

Sunday, May 22

Behold God

Today's readings: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29; Psalm 67:2-3, 5, 6, 8; Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23; John 14:23-29.

"O God, let all the nations praise you!" we sing in the refrain of the responsorial psalm. Praising God is one of the ways we pray. As the Easter season wanes, perhaps it is time to reflect on ways to integrate words of praise in our prayer life. In the verses sung from Psalm 67 today, the psalmist acclaims the way God rules his people and guides the nations. Where in your life can you see and acclaim the work of God?

During the fifty days of this Easter season, when we contemplate the joy we receive from God's love, seek to deepen your prayer life. Spending time praying the psalms of the season is one way to do that. Those psalms will help you rest in the knowledge that we are never alone.

Another way to increase your prayer life is to spend time with a phrase from Scripture. For example, bring to prayer the words from the Gospel: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." Repeat the words and then quietly sit with them, allowing them to penetrate you. Taking time to pray personally and with a community opens up a world where grace, beauty, and love are ever present and, as the late spiritual writer Anthony de Mello, SJ, said, you will find "God beholding you ... and smiling."


