



The Archdiocese of St. Louis has designated the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal in Perryville, Missouri, as a Sacred Pilgrimage Site for Pope Francis' Jubilee Year of Hope. You are invited to attend a special Mass at the National Shrine on Sunday, December 29, at 11:00 a.m. The Jubilee Year of Hope begins December 24, 2024, and continues through January 6, 2026.

When making a solemn, prayerful visit to the National Shrine and/or any designated sacred site, the faithful can obtain a Jubilee Indulgence:

- · by participation in Holy Mass or another liturgical service such as Morning or Evening Prayer or acts of piety such as Stations of the Cross, praying the Rosary, or visits to the Blessed Sacrament;
- and there, for a suitable period of time, engage in Eucharistic adoration and meditation, concluding with the Our Father, the Profession of Faith from Mass, and a prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

- 2. Estimate Your Tax Liability based on what you paid last year. Fill out all fields for the MOScholars Tax Credit Reservation System.
- 3. Choose Bright Futures Fund from the EAO (Educational Assistance Organization) drop down menu.
- 4. Reserve Your Tax Credit Amount by December 31, 2024. You will receive an Email from the Missouri State Treasurer's office. Print and save your confirmation number. You will receive a 100% tax credit for 50% of your tax obligation.
- 5. Write a check to The Bright Futures Fund for the amount of tax credits reserved. Mail your check by December 31, 2024, to: Bright Futures Fund, PO Box 419037, Kansas City, MO 64141. After verification from the state, you will receive an Email receipt. Include the receipt and a MO-TC form with your state income tax filing. (For the current MO-TC form, visit the Bright Futures Fund Website or search MO-TC at https://dor.mo.gov/forms/).



Prepare the Way

O Emmanuel

Monday, December 23

Today's antiphon is "O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!" With the end of Advent near, pray with the song "O Come, O Come Emmanuel," and if you are able, go to Mass today. Ask God to help you see that he is coming to save us. Consider how you, like Zechariah, might speak blessing God. *Today's readings: Malachi 3:1-4, 23-24; Psalm 25:4-5ab, 8-9, 10 and 14; Luke 1:57-66.*

Sing the Goodness of the Lord Tuesday, December 24

Today we hear the Canticle of Zechariah in the Gospel. Like the Canticle of Mary, this hymn proclaims the greatness of the Lord. Zechariah's praise of God speaks of the Lord's mercy, guidance, and salvation. Apart from the inevitable chaos of preparing for tomorrow's celebrations, write a canticle of praise. Remember to "worship him without fear!" *Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16; Psalm 89:2-3, 4-5, 27 and 29; Luke 1:67-79.*

The Nativity of the Lord Wednesday, December 25

Alleluia! "A light has shone," today a Savior is born for us! Amidst the darkness and constant pull of worldly desires, rest in abundant joy knowing that the "Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace" reigns and sustains, "both now and forever." Resolve to proclaim this good news during Christmas Time. How can you "announce his salvation" and tell of "his wondrous deeds"? Consider sending mail to family and friends, baking Christmas cookies for someone who is homebound, or serving at a shelter. Today's readings: Vigil: Isaiah 62:1-5; Psalm 89:4-5, 16-17, 27, 29 (2a); Acts 13:16-17, 22-25; Matthew 1:1-25. Midnight: Isaiah 9:1-6; Ps 96:1-2, 2-3, 11-12, 13; Titus 2:11-14; Luke 2:1-14. Dawn: Isaiah 62:11-12; Psalm 97:1, 6, 11-12; Titus 3:4-7; Luke 2:15-20. Day: Isaiah 52:7-10; Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4, 5-6 (3c); Hebrews 1:1-6; John 1:1-18.

St. Stephen, Martyr Thursday, December 26

The Church celebrate the witness of St. Stephen, who was chosen by the community of disciples to share Jesus' teachings. St. Stephen was stoned for "working great wonders and signs among the people." Read the account of his witness and martyrdom in Acts 6-7:60. Pray for the courage to model yourself after this saint's discipleship. *Today's readings: Acts 6:8-10, 7:54-59; Psalm 31:3cd-4, 6 and 8ab, 16bc and 17; Matthew 10:17-22.*

St. John, Apostle and Evangelist Friday, December 27

Today we celebrate the Feast of St. John, apostle and evangelist. From this saint, we hear that the faithful are to share the Good News, or to evangelize "so that you too may have fellowship ... with the Father and with his Son." The work of evangelization is done in community: in today's Gospel, Mary Magdalene and two disciples share the news of the resurrection of the Lord. With whom do you share the call to evangelize? Say a prayer for that person and consider reaching out in gratitude for the partnership. *Today's readings: 1 John 1:1-4; Psalm 97:1-2, 5-6, 11-12; John 20:1a and 2-8.*

Feast of the Holy Innocents Saturday, December 28

Just as the angel told Joseph in the dream, King Herod searched for Jesus "to destroy him." Mary and Joseph take Jesus and flee, seeking refuge and safety. Today, on the Feast of the Holy Innocents, we honor the first martyrs: the children massacred in Bethlehem by King Herod as he searched for baby Jesus. If there is a pantry or community center near you, donate baby supplies, such as diapers or baby food. Say a prayer for those who are persecuted, for refugees, migrants, and displaced persons seeking safety. *Today's readings:* 1 John 1:5-2:2; Psalm 124:2-3, 4-5, 7b-8; Matthew 2:13-18.

Sunday, December 22

Leaping for Joy

Today's readings: Micah 5:1-4a; Psalm 80:2-3, 15-16, 18-19; Hebrews 10:5-10; Luke 1:39-45.

Just before today's Gospel, the angel Gabriel tells Mary that she will "bear a son" (Luke 1:31). As confirmation of the pregnancy, Gabriel says that Elizabeth, is also pregnant. Since Elizabeth is past childbearing age, Gabriel implies that if Elizabeth is pregnant, Mary can be as well: "for nothing will be impossible for God" (1:37). Finally, when Elizabeth greets Mary, we hear that she is blessed because she "believed that what was spoken ... by the Lord would be fulfilled."

This fulfillment is proclaimed in the first reading as Micah shares his prophecy of salvation: "From you shall come forth for me / one who is to be ruler in Israel / ... / his greatness / shall reach to the ends of the earth; / he shall be peace." The Letter to the Hebrews tells of Jesus' sacrifice for the forgiveness of our sins, for as is sung in the refrain of the responsorial psalm, "we shall be saved."

Knowing this, Elizabeth exclaims, "the infant in my womb leaped for joy" the moment she heard Mary's greeting. Overcome by the Holy Spirit, mother and son anticipated the coming of the Lord. As we enter the final week of Advent, how can you ready yourself so that you, too, can leap for joy when the Lord approaches?
